


Activities | Switch Witch

Switch Witch Chandelier




MATERIALS NEEDED:

- (1) 24" Wreath Frame
- (1) 16" Wreath Frame
- 30 feet of 5.5" wide Black Burlap ribbon
- Hot glue gun and glue sticks
- Scissors
- (10) Black embroidery floss
- Tape measure or measuring stick
- (1) Pack of 25 sheets 12"X12" black cardstock
- 1/8" hole punch

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Wrap your 24" and 16" hoop in black burlap ribbon. When you get to the end tuck the end under the wrapped fabric and use your hot glue gun to secure into place.
2. Cut (4) three foot pieces of embroidery floss. Tie the end of one piece onto your covered 24" wreath frame. Measure directly across from it and tie another piece of embroidery floss. Repeat this step with the other two pieces of embroidery floss making sure all are evenly spaced around your wreath frame.
3. While keeping the wreath frame flat on the floor, pull all four pieces up and tie a knot at the top. This step ensures that your chandelier will hang evenly.
4. Next, take your 16" wreath frame and tie it as you did with the 24" frame.
**Having your 24" wreath frame hanging or having a friend hold it up for you will make this step easier.
5. Take your witch printout and make a template on a piece of black card stock. (Makes it easier to trace the printout.)
6. Take your witch template and trace onto the black card stock. Cut out all of your witch shapes and make a hole punch at the top of her hat. You should get about two witches per sheet of paper. Start by cutting out about 24 witches.
7. Cut 14" pieces of embroidery floss for the switch witches you have cutout. Thread through the hole and tie a knot.
8. Tie the opposite end of the Embroidery thread to the hoop. Repeat until your hoop looks full and you have the desired amount of witches hanging. Have fun spacing these out and playing with different lengths of the thread to create movement!

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
